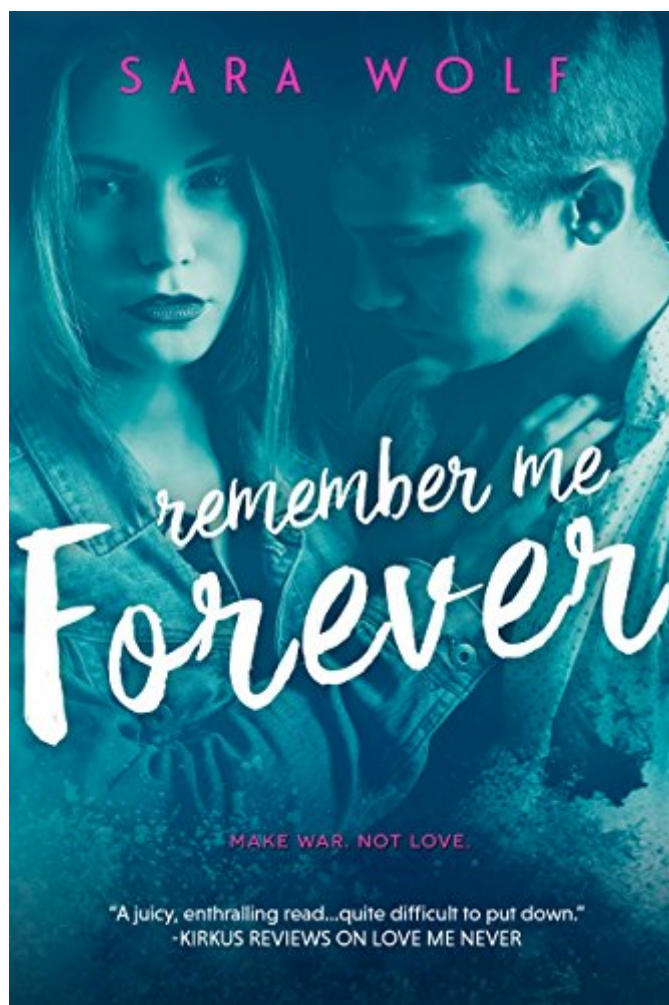

The author did a fantastic job creating one of the most memorable and fun characters. She is snarky, intelligent, non-conforming, crass, and just an all around free spirit. Like a fire to a candle, her vivacious personality lights up a room. People are drawn to her or more often than not worn down or worn out by her silly thoughts and untamed tongue. However, it is clear she is using her silliness and babbling as a deflection when life becomes too serious. Her crushed self esteem, and heart break are an albatross. And although she is a beautiful girl, she allows others to define her. It was so entertaining to read about her crazy and silly antics, but at the same time sad to know this was a coping mechanism to bury the pain of a very hurt young lady. It is sad to hear her constantly call herself ugly and so utterly heartbreaking that she endures so much bullying. But, like a butterfly, once she gains wings - she soars! Jack is the opposite of Isis. He knows he is eye candy to ladies and envied by the men, so he uses his Abacrombie, male- model looks to his advantage. However, in the end he is the one feeling used rather than being the user. He is seriously smart, extremely loyal, and a highly sensitive young man. But just like Isis uses humor to ward off others of getting a glimpse of her true self, he uses a cold stance, cruel words, and selfish facade as a cover, so people won't see the true man inside. These two go through a lot! I loved reading about their friendship and seeing it blossom into a committed relationship. I loved that these two had hangups, issues and raw life scars. They are not perfect, but they are perfect together! It took them awhile (two books before) to get there - but it was such a page turner. But, holy smokes once they are together the pages sizzle. Remember Me forever is the final book in the Lovely Vicious trilogy following Isis Blake's final year of high school and freshman year of college. I pre-ordered this book and then couldn't bring myself to read it. I fell madly in love with Isis. She's one of the most complex leading ladies in contemporary

literature; such a damaged, quirky, intelligent, kind, resilient, scared (yet brave) soul. She so badly wants love (Jack), but doesn't feel worthy (thanks to Nameless). I was scared to start this book due to my fear that Isis wouldn't get the life she wants, the one she deserves. Over the weekend I stumbled across it; one glance and I was sucked in and couldn't stop until I finished in the wee hours of the morning. This book was mostly a worthy conclusion to the trilogy. The book picks up a few months after Sophia's funeral. Isis, Wren, and Kayla are preparing to leave for college. Jack is missing. He took off after the funeral without a word to anyone. Isis gave up Stanford and is attending The Ohio State. She has met the roommate of her heart, Yvette, has made a friend or two, and is settling into campus life when she runs into Nameless. As if that's not shocking enough Jack turns up on his heels and it's not the long awaited reunion of her dreams. Jack is determined to stay away from Isis. He feels that he ruined Sophia and is not willing to risk ruining Isis. Nameless, on the other hand, loves the power he holds over Isis and is determined to torment her. Isis continues to be her quirky self with her running inner dialogue, but she's struggling. Her pain over Nameless has never subsided, her pain over Jack is even worse. She's reached the point where she's convinced she's unlovable and that it's understandable because she's just not worth the trouble. She makes some bad choices during this time trying to lessen her pain. The story is told in dual POV between Isis and Jack which at times is not clearly stated, so it required me to double back a few times for clarity's sake. I'm thankful that we did get insight into Jack during the book at times. Even knowing his thought process, I was not a fan of the Ice Prince in this book. He made plenty of excuses; he wasn't worthy of Isis, he only hurt girls, he didn't deserve happiness. The truth was he was a coward. He wasn't worthy of Isis, but she wanted him. She gets to make the decision of his worthiness for herself. And then when he went back to his old tricks, it was just too much for me. I had a hard time dealing with his past to begin with, but this was even more unacceptable. Isis never deserved the hurt he sent her way. When she asked him if he knew how many times he had made her cry; I asked the same thing. My heart broke for her over and over. The time came however, when excuses fell away and love overcame. It was everything I hoped for. Passionate, sweet, beautiful, fun, forever. Sara Wolf is an excellent writer. Her dialogue, inner and regular, is exceptional. There was drama, angst, and humor. I enjoyed the book and would definitely recommend it, but it wasn't all that I had hoped for. Jack was so awful for more than half of the book. Isis was miserable during the same amount. The shadows of Nameless and Sophia loomed. I've been desperate for Isis and Jack to get together since book 1 and it took until the final 1/4 of the book for it to finally happen. I wanted more time to celebrate them together. Their coupledness was exactly as I had hoped, but I didn't get enough. The time jumps were great teasers, but again I

wanted more. I blame Sara. If she hadn't made these incredible characters and drawn me into their lives like she did, I would have been completely satisfied. However, she did create these beautiful people and I wanted more happy time with them together; Isis enthusiastically rattling on with Jack finally relaxed, content with a little half smile or Isis leading them into hijinks. Still it's hard to be upset. Isis ended up happy. That's all I ever wanted.
