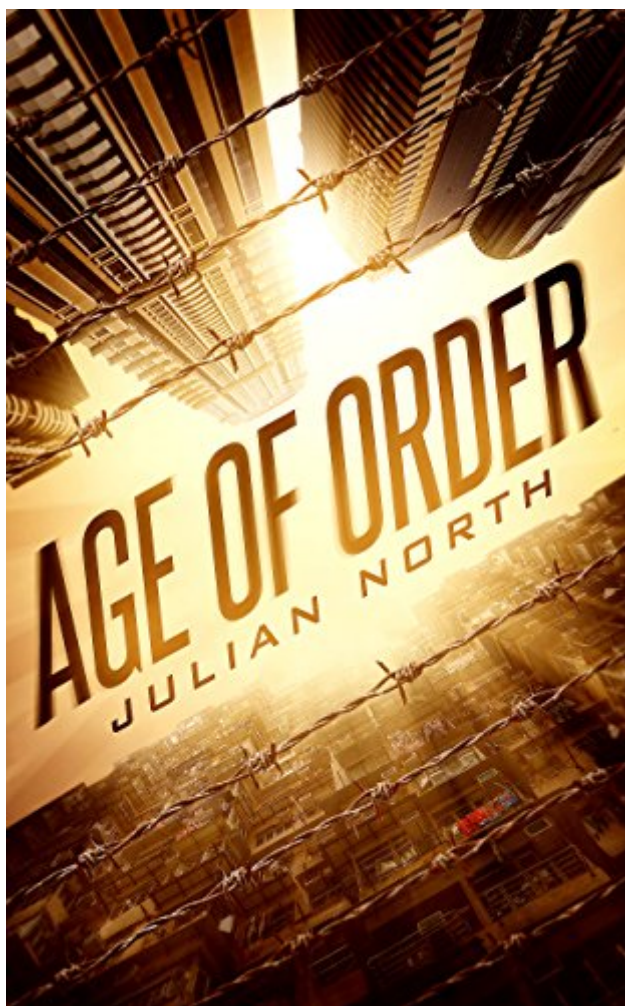


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Age Of Order: Book 1 Of The Age Of Order Saga

This is an engaging story set in a unique version of a dystopian world. The writing is better than some of the extremely successful series in this genre, impressive for a first-time author. The humanity and decency of some of the characters is very well-crafted. This kept my interest and made me want to see what happens next. I didn't want the book to end and I hope to have a chance to visit this world again soon!

My favorite genres are "Apocalyptic, Dystopian and Sci-Fi"..... This book and too "Rise of Order" are my first exposure with this author. I've since added her to my favorite authors to follow. As history shows many times over (and over, and over.....) some things never change! You have a segment of society who loves power, and will do anything to keep it, and then there's the segment (the majority) who want a fair shot, and too want to raise a family and enjoy life in general. This historical pattern is shown very well in this book. Author Julian North built excellent/strong characters, no question. What I also enjoyed is when some characters whom were antagonists, became protagonists in the end - many of which I didn't see coming! Rich or poor, young or old, these characters and their roles were believable and plausible. Ms. Julie, to this reader, you have a "Win-Win" here for sure! This author's first novel is action-packed, fun to read, and enables teen readers to take a closer look at self-transformation and its costly impact. The narrator is a teenage girl with impressive self discipline. She throws herself into a mental struggle with a section of society who have benefited from generations of genetic manipulation in order to save her brother from a genocidal disease called the Waste. As the story unfolds, the young people around her have to choose whether or not they will take up the fight to demonstrate their lingering humanity. The Waste is a disease of the poor and expendable people who are cut off from any hope of prosperity. The narrator must temper her anguish for her brother's fate and use it to fuel her quest for a cure. The author addresses the big questions that teenagers must answer when establishing their own identities in an unjust world.

Genetics, eugenics and genocide all in one book! I liked the story but did grow weary of the

enormous chip that Daniella wore on her shoulder. While some of the anger and resentment she harbored was to be expected, it was too much and distracted me from the story. I hope to see more from this author in the future.

I couldn't put this book down, I really hope there are more books that take place in this universe maybe around Boston or LA. I am not a patient reader so when an author pulls me in immediately, it's always a good thing. The descriptions were excessively wordy in places but over all it added to the setting more than it detracted so it wasn't enough of an issue for me to consider it a negative. I've already got the novelette and look forward to more from Julian North.

I truly enjoyed reading this ride from the ghetto to the halls of power where all is not quite as it appears. If you like your sci-fi full of mystery, lies, false impressions, with a bit of romance like a rosebud on the cusp of opening to none other than the "enemy" then this is a good read, full of human foibles to the ultimate of our ability to love and respect than look no further. While at times key figures could be fleshed out more, at times long winded, it's delivers in style the good, bad and the ugly. A sequel would be on my "to read" list
