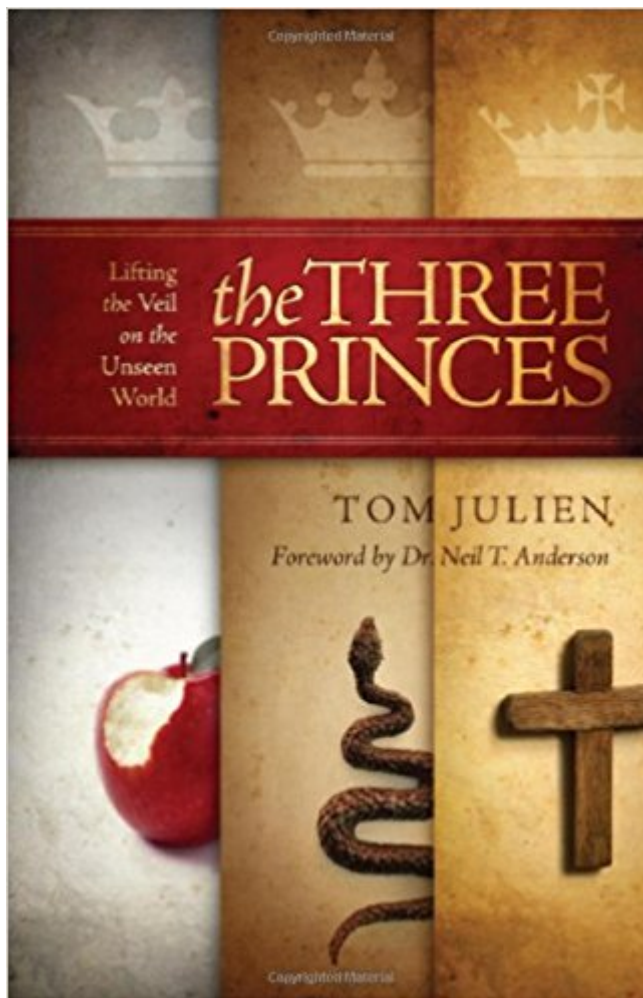

Tom Julien is a graduate of Bob Jones University and Grace Theological Seminary. He is a former missionary of 28 years, and served as Executive Director of Grace Brethren International Missions. He is the author of the highly-acclaimed missions book, *Antioch Revisited*.

Tom Julien, in his book *The Three Princes*, takes the Bible from cover to cover and writes the story of redemption and of the often-ignored spiritual battle that is taking place. Tom tells the story in terms of the three princes of this world. The first prince of the world was Adam, made especially by God to rule the newly created world. As you know, Adam's reign was tragically short. His authority is taken from him by the second prince of this world, Satan. The unseen battle has begun. Satan is determined to lead mankind in a complete rebellion against God. The Old Testament is filled with the downward spiral of man's sin and God's judgment. But there is hope! There is one more Prince, Jesus Christ, who comes to earth as a man to redeem what was lost. Tom Julien, a retired missionary to France, accomplishes what the subtitle to the book suggests: he lifts the veil of the unseen world. Most of us are pretty ignorant of what is taking place in the spiritual realm. And quite frankly, I think we are happy to stay that way. But, after reading *The Three Princes*, your eyes will

be opened a little more to the spirit world. He shows the intense conflict that started in the Garden of Eden and the way it will end in the book of Revelation. But he also shows that this battle is happening today. His practical words on Satan's schemes (chapter 10), utilizing the armor of God (chapters 12-13), and prayer (chapter 14) are chapters I could read on a monthly basis to remind me the importance of my daily walk with Jesus. The Three Princes is filled with God's word. It is hard to find a page that doesn't quote or reference the Bible. There is a Scripture Index in the back of the book where you can find that hundreds of verses from 36 books of the Bible are quoted. I really appreciated that Tom doesn't just tell you what he believes, but he shows you in the Bible where he bases his beliefs. The Three Princes does a great job of telling the redemption story of the Bible in a big-picture format. Sometimes I am so familiar with the stories in the Bible, or I get so focused on small segments that I can lose track of the main theme. It was refreshing to read a book that highlighted God's entire dramatic plan and allowed me to review it all in a few hours. The Three Princes is an easy to read book that is filled with solid Bible teaching as well as an encouragement to stand firm in the midst of the unseen battle around us.

Spiritual warfare is a subject that can quickly go off the rails. Mr Julien affords a glimpse into real life experiences without losing a biblical perspective! That is the ONLY way understanding happens. I have given copies to friends who are just learning the nature of an unseen war that we're caught up in. You cannot fight what you cannot see unless you have understanding! This well written work is VERY understandable... as well as timely!

It's rare for me to write a review for a book, even more rare for me to be impacted as I've been by this book. Not for those looking for a surface, high level discussion of the theological interplay between Adam, Satan and Jesus, this book dives deep into thoughts and ideas that will make you think, wonder, and evaluate your views on the world today. Tom Julien has produced what may be his most meaningful, and valuable, piece of literature.

This book really helped me to recognize how and why the spiritual realm has power to influence the human realm.

It has been said that Satan works best when he is either underestimated, overestimated, or ignored. Many Christians are suffering areas of defeat in their lives because they are unaware of the enemy's tactics. The problem with much literature concerning spiritual warfare is that it is not

grounded in biblical theology. This book by Tom Julien is an exception. Julien grounds his thesis in the scriptures and his own life experiences. He especially excels when he describes the incarnation, passion, resurrection, and exaltation of Christ. Having studied some of the writings of the Early Church Fathers concerning the incarnation, I found that this author soars in his description, and his theology of the incarnation certainly affirms that we do "have a great high priest that can be touched by our infirmities." His description of the "outer darkness" that Christ suffered for us on the cross opens up a fresh revelation of the cost that Jesus paid for our full redemption. The way that he describes Christ's victory and how that relates to victory in the life of a Christian is worth the price of the book. I highly recommend this book and believe that it will be a classic in the area of spiritual warfare and victorious Christian living.

The Three Princes is without doubt the most stimulating and provocative book I have read in recent years. As the author discusses familiar events in the unfolding "Drama of Redemption," he raises questions of significant importance and proceeds to answer them from his years of Bible study and experience in ministry. Readers may not always be persuaded to Julien's viewpoint, but they will be forced to read and study the Scriptures carefully to come to a clearer understanding of God's Word and the truth that is the means of conforming us to the image of Christ. Julien stands firmly on the revealed truth of Scripture, but he does not take positions arrogantly. He humbly presents God's Word and biblical principles as he understands them with the challenge to study the Bible to affirm the truth. It is the affirming of our position in Christ that enables us to stand in the spiritual battle against the unseen world about which Julien writes.

There are few books that I include on a must-read list - because everyone's experience is different and a given book might not be applicable. But this crystal-clear work by Tom Julien deals with critical issues for the Christian which I have yet to see elsewhere. The novel style (in both senses of the word) is easy to understand, yet game-changing in its depth of insight. Time is needed to absorb all the implications contained in such a modest-sized tome, but that time is well worth the investment - both for life in this world and the next.
