

A continuation of Myrtle's story & the secret she held onto throughout her life. There was some areas (mostly in the first 3 chapters) that were a little bit disjointed. I was wondering whether JB Rowley was trying to catch people up and reflect over the last book Whisper My Secret 1. There was quite a bit of information about the orphanage systems and societal views. The horrendous lives children in orphanages led form images of beings plodding through 'life' trying to remain hidden within small shells attempting to get through the years drawing as little attention as possible. Abuse suffered by these children and their suffering continues today, cannot be imagined by many. My heart goes out to them all. While written in a somewhat different manner of Whisper My Secret 1 (which was much more of Myrtle's story), Whisper My Secret 2 tends to read as a research paper with some personal information thrown into the mix. There were so many things that I would have liked to known. I do recommend that readers prepare themselves by reading Whisper My Secret 1 before reading Whisper My Secret 2. By doing so I think I became very emotionally involved and connected to all of Myrtle's family. I would recommend this book to anyone who is interested in societal views through the years, readers who are interested in how life was lived, what children & their mothers have endured within the system, and how woman's rights were so horrifyingly absent in regards to their bodies, lives, and children.
