

This book is one of the most opinionated "historical" account of Sino-American relation. Easy to ready history that deals with the media bias both leading up to Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor and carried into US relations with both the ROC and PRC and into the Vietnam War. The author could have been more evenhanded in his reporting of facts, which, at times, seem cherry picked to support his thesis that the US was a willing dupe in entering WW II. Strongest material is that developed about the role of the China lobby and the influence on the American publics thinking between WW I and WW II, then culminating in the fallout during the McCarthy period.

If you like history and have questions about our far east foreign policy in the last 100 years this is your book. I learned a great deal. I have no reason not to believe the reporting in this book although one could hope that at least a portion of it is not true. How top government officials and other experts could screw up so miserably is truly disturbing. I literally had to put the book down at times to let myself calm down over the reporting of one stupid decision after another. I'm a life long Republican so I suppose my negative view of FDR can be discounted by some. How he ever got to be viewed at one of the country's greatest presidents is beyond me. His know-it-all arrogance of cultures he did not begin to understand remind me of what is happening in the middle east today.

But what may surprise most of us is that Presidents Teddy Roosevelt, Franklin Roosevelt, Eisenhower, and Johnson were similarly misled into policies that resulted in wars with Japan, Korea, and Viet Nam that did not have to happen. They misread communications and were totally misled into allying with Chang instead of Mao and Diem instead of Minh. Loaded information came from a college friend of Teddy who became envoy Meiji, China missionaries, China propagandists, and Time magazine. This book tells the history of the roots of our woe begotten relations with Japan, then China, then Korea, then Viet Nam. How the China Lobby in our country bamboozled our people, our government, and all but a few outcaste military, ambassadors, and intelligence officers. It explains how foreign policy may arise from the secret manipulations of presidents behind the backs of experienced officers of State and Defense. By analogy it calls attention to the dangers of foreign interested lobbyists like the AIPAC, and those currently collecting favors from presidential hopefuls like the Clintons; and it warns of the catastrophes that can result from opinion based news like Fox. You may not need to read this book,

but our presidents certainly do.

This book points out the many failures over 150+ year history of US policy in China and in Asia. It also bring to light just how deep many of the US political and economic icons were involved in the opium trade to make their fortunes. But most of all it points out the folly of getting your intelligence from biased and often totally ignorant sources, such as the Christian evangelists in the pre-1950 eras who had very close ties to Washington. The book is not perfect - it tends to gloss over a bit on other outside factors, such as Stalin, but since this is a book about China and Asia, I would not expect it to delve deep into those aspects.

Excellent rebuttal to common wisdom related to our misunderstanding a sleeping Tiger. Bradley does an excellent job of pursuing the facts, regardless of how inconvenient they may be. For over 50 years the US has made strategic decisions in Asia in a fantasy land filled with mirages. The only criticism I have of the book is a reference to B-52s being launched from islands during WWII--they were B-29s. Not sure how that slipped by the proof-readers.
