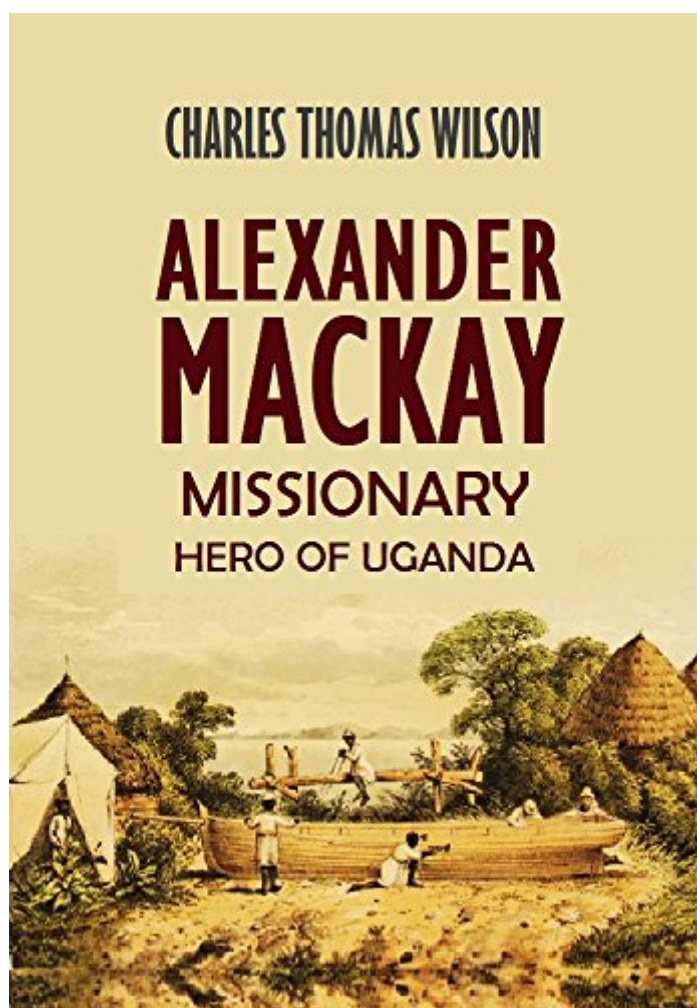


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Alexander Mackay: Missionary Hero Of Uganda (1894) (With Interactive Table Of Contents)
