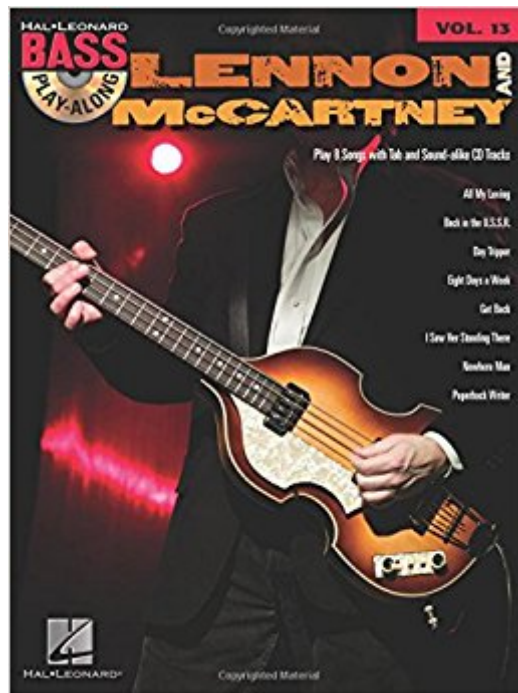

[Heavy sigh.] First, the good news: some of the bass lines tabbed here appear fairly accurate or better, although plenty of sections are not at all what McCartney is playing on the recordings.

There's a mix of interesting (difficult) walking bass lines, such as "All my Loving," but with some far more simple (boring) bass lines, such as "Eight Days a Week" consisting of basically two or three notes played repeatedly for measure after measure. If you want to play along with your old Beatles records, that could be fun, but it's mostly useless as a teaching tool. Given that the publisher had the whole gamut of Lennon/McCartney songs to choose from, one would think they'd include more of the interesting songs for the bass. Some of the licks, while occasionally accurate, are nevertheless very difficult to imagine played within the song, as they simply do not appear to fit with

the harmony. So learning them is a challenge, without being able to hear what they're supposed to sound like. That brings up the bad news: the accompanying CD is worse than worthless. I bought the book on the promise that it included bass isolation tracks plus ensemble "play along" tracks for each song, plus "slow down" software which permits changing the songs' tempo without changing the pitch. That last part is partly true: the software is included on the disk, and it mostly works. But it only works with this disk, so if you want to use it to slow down your commercial music to learn it, you'll have to pay extra. However, the order of tracks is not the same on the disk as in the book, and there are no titles on the disk. So you'll just have to figure out whether you're hearing the right track or not. This isn't as easy as it sounds, since (1) the bass isolation tracks are not as advertised: you'll hear percussion, lead guitar, and perhaps some bass (2) the bass is not playing what's written in the book, and (3) the bass isolation tracks all sound nearly identical to the insipid ensemble play-along tracks, none of which sounds very much like the Beatles. It's doubly frustrating when trying to listen to a particularly confusing passage in the book to see what it's supposed to sound like, only to find out it's not on the disk at all or if it is, it's buried beneath all the other instruments so you can't hear it. Maybe they thought it would help to have the bass playing what's evidently written in some other book. Again, you'd think the publisher would have included instructions, but no. But for the pointless disk, the book would merit an additional star or even two. Do yourself a favor: save some money by buying a used book without the disk: the Kindle version only saves less than a buck, and you won't get music or "slow down" feature, except for maybe on a handful of devices, where the print will be too small to read. Why pay extra for something that doesn't work?
