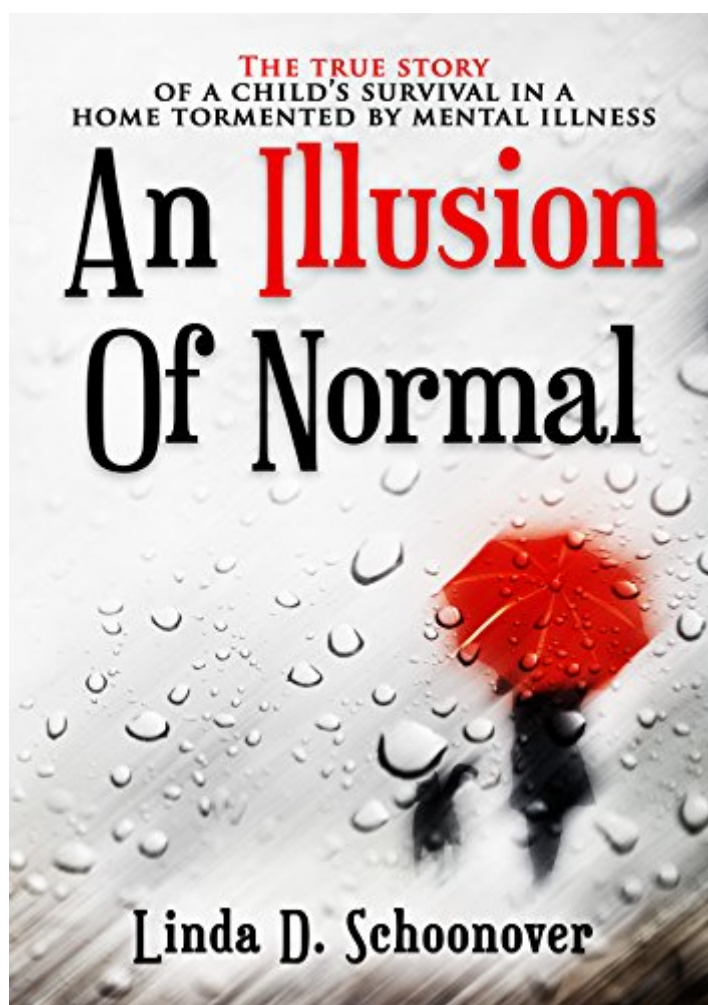

This book is a serious eye-opener to adults who may be inflicting great suffering and damage to children who live under their influence or custody. In fact, many adults will relate to this story as children they once might have been surrounded by mentally affected adults. Disturbing at times, this is a book hard to put down, as along with the stressing scenes the reader still can hold on to a string of hope of deliverance. I was profoundly touched by this account and believe more people should be made aware of what they are doing to children under their care or even understand the kind of adults they have become after being influenced by disturbed adults.

Written in the first person, from childhood recollections, this is one of the books we like to pretend never happened. Surely, this is all a novel. This never happened. Just as the family spent effort pretending life behind their door was normal, those of us outside put effort into pretending we see nothing....walk on by. As the book progressed, the main thing that alarmed me was the father, who was apparently almost as disturbed as his wife. The resilience of the human spirit shines through the two young people as they survive, and learn to thrive. More than anything else, what it proves is an abusive, insane environment doesn't always produce abusive, insane people.

Her writing moved at a perfect pace, allowing enough description and time for detail and insights into her childhood perceptions and yet not keeping the reader caught in the trap she lived in. I would recommend this book to everyone. It brings to light an environment that so many children and families deal with every day to varying degrees. *An Illusion of Normal* vividly portrays how children are at the mercy of their environments and how that environment writes their inner script that is overloaded with self-judgments not based on reality. I applaud Schoonover for her bravery in sharing her story and for her determination to save herself by removing herself from the illness, educating herself and finally working for the benefit of children coming from similar circumstances.

Barely into the book and I had tears in my eyes as I imagined myself in the shoes of the author who, at the mere age of 4, was faced with the prospect of losing her mother to death. This memoir is a touching tribute, and at times a revealing and confronting account of what life was really like growing up in a family that was touched by mental illness, making it different from most families, and yet, just like so many families in so many ways.
