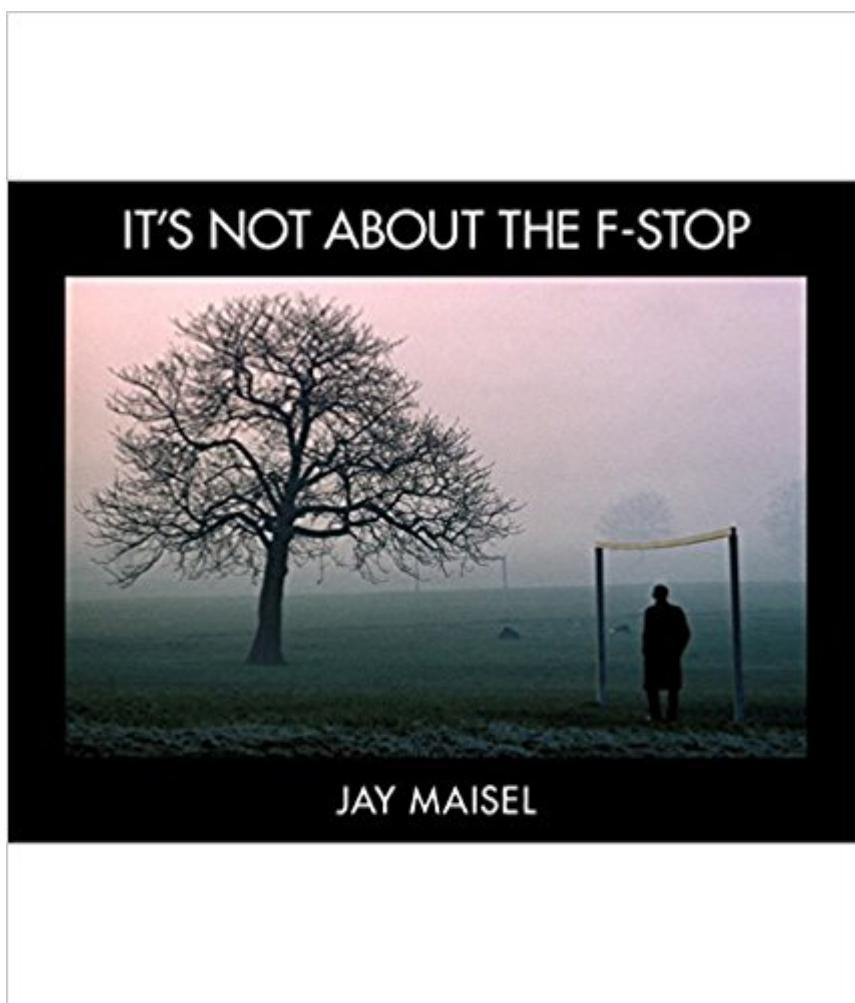

Synopsis

I know little about professional photography, but I am passionate about it. I am not that interested in the holy trinity - aperture, speed, light sensitivity. I am interested in mood, light, ambience and intuition. My teachers have been myself and books. Many books are quite good about the technical aspects - most in fact. But the subjective aspect is illusive and mysterious. It is quite personal. Some books help in this respect. Reading Jay's books, personally, gives me that mood. Thanks Jay, even though I do not know you. If you are into feel, intuition and no BS, read this book.

I purchased this book due to a clip I saw on YouTube pertaining to Jay Maisel. Jay, who is a giant in the world of photography, has been, and still is, my favorite photographer. He is our modern Ansel. After reading the book, it gives a great deal of introspection, revelation and insight into why certain photographs were taken, the situation or surroundings. Jay isn't beholden to the restrictive guidelines that impede most photographers who believe guidelines are gospel. Stepping not just outside but beyond conformity is why his work is seminal and will be for a great deal longer.

Jay Maisel has a unique eye and a unique voice. He is one of the greatest photographers of the modern era, and is unquestionably one of the pioneers of urban color photography. He is also a famous teacher, and his comments are notoriously wry, profane, and wise in equal measure. The photos in this book and in the companion "Light, Gesture, Color", also recently published by New Riders/KelbyOne, ranging over the decades of his career, are beautiful and nicely reproduced. The photos and commentary are different in the two volumes, but the beauty and inspiration are the same. This book, like its companion, is a treasure.

Some inspiring thoughts in this book. Helps the photographer to get back to the basics of composition and think of seeing through the viewfinder. Jay Maisel has had a long and illustrious career with many high profile clients and many great photos so his insights are most useful. Many of us, of course, won't have the opportunity to shoot in exotic locations with art directors or models but Maisel's approach to seeing is helpful even to those of us who never get to leave Podunk. A worthwhile read for sure.

All people new to photography should read this book, and look at it, carefully! It is instructive, serious, humorous. You never know what the next pair of pages will reveal. It presents a view of what photographers do, or should be doing, that is different from the usual class room and text book fare. There is much here, even for veteran photographers.
