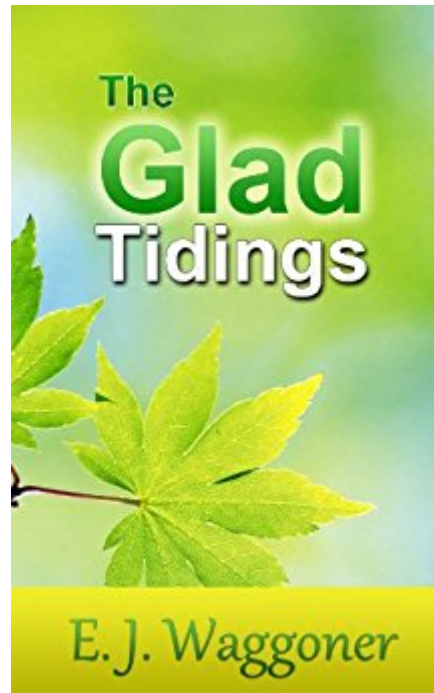

In the Autumn of 1888, in Minneapolis, Minnesota, a young man delivered a series of lectures on the book of Galatians to a group of Seventh-day Adventist ministers and church leaders. The young man was an evangelist, a medical doctor, and co-editor of the Signs of the Times. His name was Ellet J. Waggoner. In his audience sat Ellen G. White.
