

Very interesting book! It does a great job of telling this history of American English by going through the history of the United States and drawing out how words came into being used. As always, Bryson writes in a way that is informative and entertaining.

This is the second time that I have read Bill Bryson's masterful essay, documenting the major influences in American history and how these events have shaped the language and created new words. I enjoyed it as much the second time as the first, 20 years previously. As might be expected, words are added continuously to the American melting pot, especially word derived from several languages spoken by immigrants. Equally significant has been the influence of major changes to society, such as the advent of railways, movies and computers. Bill Bryson is a man who is completely comfortable with and an authority on the topic of 'language'. What is unexpected is just how entertaining, readable and relevant is his account of the topic. This is a book that is different,

one that I recommend strongly to all with an interest in words, their derivation and meaning.

Humorous and LOADED with fun facts and interesting information. Buy it! This led me to other Bill Bryson books, all of which I loved as well. I got this in a Yankee Swap....lucky me!

This is a book about the development of American English. It is written for the casual reader, not scholars. To give context, he includes cultural and technological history. Bryson is amazing. Of course, he writes well. Of course, he chooses interesting topics. What is not "of course" is how much he packs into so few words.
